Joining the Team

All prospective volunteers go through an entry process which will include an interview, background check and a variety of other procedures as determined by the Frazier Museum and the Volunteer Coordinator. A series of documents must be signed and returned to the Volunteer Coordinator before the volunteer reaches active status and can begin work at the Museum. This may include:

- * Confidentiality Policy
- * Badge Application
- * Background Check Waiver
- * Manual Acknowledgement
- * Interview
- * Orientation

Frazier Museum Quick Facts

- * The site of the Frazier Museum originally was home to a building constructed in the 1800s for a tobacco firm and was commonly referred to as the 9th Street Tobacco Warehouse. The warehouse was destroyed by the 1890 tornado and the current building was completed in 1898.
- * The concept for the Frazier Museum came to Mr. Owsley Frazier Brown in a dream.
- * We opened our doors as the Frazier Historical Arms Museum in 2004. In 2006, the museum's name was changed to the Frazier International History Museum to reflect better the mission and vision of the museum.
- * The Frazier Museum is approximately 112,000 square feet, with 75,000 square feet of exhibit space.
- * The Frazier Museum is the only U.S. site to house items for the British Royal Armouries. Over 300 artifacts are on loan from the Royal Armouries. We are the U.S. Headquarters for the British Royal Armouries.
